

**GCSE RE Short Course-Revision Essential check list.**

**Do you know your key words off by heart? Practice!**

- **Equality**: The belief or state that everyone should have equal rights and opportunity. **Example: Free health care**
- **Identity**: The sense of who you are in terms of attitudes, character and personality. **Example: You are unique**
- **Injustice**: Where everyone **is not treated** with fairness and dignity. **Example: Lack of shelter and food**
- **Authority**: Power over others through position or moral teachings. **Example: Prime-minister, Pope**
- **Prejudice**: Judging someone before you know them to be inferior or superior. **Example: disability**
- **Discrimination**: The actions of treating groups of people differently. **Example: Racism or homophobia**

- **Responsibilities:** Duties you are expected to carry out. **Example:** Following the laws of the country
- **Commitments:** Being dedicated to someone and making promises and keeping them. **Example:** Marriage vows
- **Conflict:** The stresses and strains which occur within relationships. **Example:** Arguments
- **Reconciliation:** Apologising and making up after an argument. **Example:** Forgiveness
- **Love:** One of the most powerful human emotions. **Example:** Eros (romantic & physical love)
- **Chastity:** No sex before marriage – to remain sexually pure because sex is a gift from God and should only take place within marriage **Example:** Purity rings showing Sex is a gift from God.
