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Students are placed in some mixed ability GCSE groups. There is however, a Welsh speaking group on both sides of the year. There are 4 units of work throughout the course. Candidates will take their oral assessment (unit 1) during Year 10 and the remaining 3 units during Year 11. The context for learning the language is organised under three broad themes: **EMPLOYMENT**; **WALES AND THE WORLD** and **YOUTH**.
